

Appendix N Social Environment – Supporting Information

Age Structure of Clermont

From 1996 to 2001 all of the age groups greater than 40 years experienced an increase in population. The age group of 80 years plus experienced the greatest increase in population with a 32.3% increase. This was followed by the age group of 70 to 79 years which increased by 16.3%.

All age groups below the age of 40 experienced a decline in population between 1996 and 2001. The age group of 30 to 39 year olds experienced the highest decrease in population with -36.1% followed by the age group of 0 to 9 years with -33.2%.

Age structure of Clermont compared to Queensland

In Clermont the age groups of 20 to 29, 30 to 39 and 50 to 59 years are smaller than the Queensland proportions. The proportion of people over the age of 60 years of age in Clermont is larger than the Queensland average with the age group of 60 to 69 years being 0.7% larger than the Queensland proportion. The age group of 0 to 9 was larger in Clermont, with a proportion of 15.2% compared to 14% in Queensland.

Labour Force

All age groups between 19 years and 64 years of age experienced a decrease in the number of people employed in the labour force. The largest decrease was in the 25 to 34 year age group where the number of employed people decreased from 302 to 217 persons.

In 2001 the age group with the largest number of persons employed was the 35 to 44 year age group, with 257 persons.

Between the two census periods the number of unemployed people decreased by 9% and the labour force decreased by 14%.
